EARLY ENTRY PROGRAMS

PRE-COLLEGE SCHOLARS

With Tougaloo College Precollege, students entering their junior or senior year of high school can apply to take college-level courses for credit and experience life as a Tougaloo College student. High school students who participate in Tougaloo College's Precollege demonstrate when they apply that they are ready for and committed to doing college-level work throughout the program. The student must possess a "B" (3.00) average or better in an accredited high school curriculum, and a score of 18 or better on the enhanced ACT assessment or a score of eight hundred (800) or better on the SAT. A student is allowed to take up to 9 credit hours (freshmen courses only).

Transcripts

PROVISIONAL ADMISSION

Students who do not meet the College's general admission requirements may be considered for provisional admission. Provisional admission offers students a chance to prove themselves academically at the College. Being admitted provisionally means you will be required to:

- 1. Submit letter of appeal.
- 2. Submit three letters of recommendation from your attending school or college official.
- 3. Complete an academic success plan.
- 4. Meet regularly with your advisor.
- 5. Earn a 2.0 GPA (C average) or higher your first semester at Tougaloo.

Financial Aid

Tougaloo College offers a high quality education at an affordable cost. And nearly 80 percent of our students receive some form of financial aid - making college more affordable than ever!

How Financial Aid Works

Tuition and fees at Tougaloo College are already low compared to other colleges and universities. Financial aid is available for students who are unable to pay all college costs. Based on federal and some state requirements, completing your FAFSA will determine your eligibility for assistance.

Financial Aid programs include academic scholarships, need-based grants, student and parent loans and employment. Other sources of assistance may include scholarship from private organizations, foundations, and some campus sources.

How New Students Apply for Financial Aid

- 1. All financial aid applicants must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
 - File the FAFSA online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.
 - Complete the FAFSA after January 1, 2016, even if you have not yet filed your 2015 tax returns. Use estimates if necessary.
 - Contact the Office of Financial Aid if you have specific questions. This is the best source of financial aid information.
- 2. Investigate other sources of aid. See the enclosed list of Scholarship resources.
- 3. Keep a file of records and copies of applications.
- 4. If you require assistance to complete the FAFSA, contact the Financial Aid Office at 601-977-7766. Check with the Financial Office to see when "Financial Aid Days" will be hosted on the campus.

How Transfer Students Apply for Financial Aid

- 1. If you did not submit a FAFSA for the current 2015-2016 academic year, you should follow the application instructions above for new students.
- 2. If you did apply for financial aid for the current 2015-2016 year, you can complete the FAFSA Renewal on the web at www.fafsa.ed.gov (You will need your pin number).
- **3.** To apply for financial aid as a transfer student go to FASFA Renewal. The code for Tougaloo College is **002439.**

How The Award Process Works

Once the College has received the FAFSA results from the federal government's processor, we review the information to arrive at your Expected Family Contribution (EFC).

Need determines how much aid a student may receive during a given year. To meet this need, the financial aid officer uses various resources to "package" a student. Pell grant is the first resource used. After that, funds available through available campus-based programs such as FSEOG, Federal Work Study, and Tougaloo scholarships or grants are used. Award notifications are mailed or emailed to the student and parent listed on the FAFSA. Students/Parents should read this carefully and follow all instructions.

Parents may wish to obtain a Direct PLUS loan or participate in a monthly payment plan. Students who do not qualify for need-based aid programs will be notified.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: We've been told we probably will not qualify for aid. Should we bother to apply?

Yes, you should? Many factors are taken into consideration in determining a family's financial need, and each family's circumstances are unique, so you can't know you'll qualify for without completing the aid application process. There is no arbitrary cut-off for determining a family's eligibility for financial aid. The income range of those eligible for assistance covers a wider page.

Q: When should I apply for aid?

File your FAFSA application as soon as possible after January 1 if you plan to enroll at Tougaloo during the period between June 2016 and March 2016. It is very important that you apply no later than March 1, 2016, if you are a freshman application planning to enroll in September. Transfer students should also apply by March 1st.

Q: Do "Early Decision" admissions applicants use an earlier financial aid process?

No. Early decision candidates who file the FAFSA application by March 1st will receive award notifications before the housing deposit is due.

Q: Will I be eligible for the same amount of financial aid each year? In most cases, the answer is yes, but not in every case. Every effort will be made to continue a similar level of institutional gift aid each year. Students receiving merit scholarships do not need to reapply to renew those scholarships as long as renewal requirements are met.

Students must reapply for need-based financial aid each year. Assuming you remain in good academic standing, file the application forms by the recommended deadline and demonstrate a similar level of need, you can expect approximately the same level of institutional gift aid

each year. Examples of circumstances that might cause a change in a need-based financial aid award could include, but are not limited to:

- A significant rise or drop in family income
- A reduction in room and meal plan expenses for students living off-campus
- More or fewer siblings in college at the same time you are attending Tougaloo
- More of fewer family members living at home.

Q: Are families expected to contribute toward education expenses?

If the student is dependent upon his or her parents for support, then the expected family contribution will include amounts from both the student and parents based on their respective incomes and assets. The contribution for students who are financial independent on their parents is based on the student's income and assets, as well as on those of the student's spouse if married.

Q: Does Tougaloo offer academic merit scholarships?

Yes. Merit scholarships are offered based on a student's academic record, leadership potential or other factors, and financial need is not taken into consideration. At Tougaloo, most merit scholarships for new students are awarded through our Presidential Scholarship program. There are also a number of merit scholarships awarded to upperclassmen based on academic performance.

Q: If my parents are divorced or separated, which parent should provide the information required to apply for aid?

You should answer the questions using information about the parent you lived within the past 12 months. If you did not live with one parent more than with the other, then provide information for the parent who

provided the most financial support for you .(Support would include money, gifts, loans, housing, food, clothes, medical care, etc.) Child support payments from your other parent will be taken into consideration, and information about the income and assets of any stepparent must also be provided. We realize that these situations can be sensitive and complicated. Please feel free to discuss your individual circumstances with one of our counselors. All information will remain confidential.

Q: What happens if our financial changes after I enter college?

While many families' financial needs remain constant while a student is attending college, some families will experience significant changes in their ability to contribute to their children's education. Sometimes these changes can even occur during the middle of an academic year. We are always willing to review financial aid appeals from families experiencing difficulties due to significant changes in their circumstances.

Q: I have been notified that I will receive a scholarship from my high school. How will this scholarship affect my financial aid?

We encourage students to apply for scholarship awarded by private organizations. If we are required to amend the financial aid award as a result of receiving an outside scholarship, we will make every effort to reduce the student's loan before reducing any grants. See the enclosed list of scholarship sources.

Q: Can I get an estimate of my college costs before I apply for admission?

Colleges are required to provide a "net price calculator" on their website to provide estimated financial aid and cost information based on institutional data for enrolled students. You can find our calculator at www.tougaloo.edu/financialaid



After January 1st; Before March 15th

Any student who wishes to apply for financial aid should file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) prior to **March 15**th (**priority deadline**). You may begin filling out the FAFSA form as soon as January 1st. Tougaloo College's school code is **002439**. Request a FASFA booklet from your high school guidance counselor or from the Financial Aid Office of the college you are currently attending. You may also go to www.fasfa.edu.gov to complete the application online, which will generate a Student Aid Report (SAR).

Mid March

The Financial Aid Office also begins mailing out "Document Tracking Letters" to all students. "Document Tracking Letters" tell the students what documents need to be turned in to the Financial Aid Office. About 80% of all students who file a FAFSA are selected for the verification process. While not all students are selected for verification, all awards are considered tentative until the verification process is complete.

Electronic award notifications to incoming first-year and transfer students are emailed in March of the calendar year.

After April 1st

Instructions on how to accept a Stafford Loan, and information on how to complete a Master Promissory Note as well as how to apply for a Parent PLUS Loan, are available after **April 1**st.

The Office of Financial Aid is "going green," which means that many of our communications will be sent electronically. Applicants should ensure that we have the most up-to-date email address, and should remember to regularly check their emails.
